INTRODUCTION

- ➤ A little background information
- Introduction of the crop for purposes of reforestation;
- ❖ Gradual economic interest with effect from the 1990's when cashew nut buyers arrived in the country from India;
- Strategic orientation of the sector.
- Commencement of organisation from 2002 (2002 Ordinance and establishment of ARECA);
- Sector reform in 2013 (Law of 2013 and establishment of the Cotton and Cashew Nut Council).
- **The sector in figures**
- 165 000 tons to 700 000 tons from 2005 to 2015;
- Leading producer and leading world exporter of raw cashew nuts with a little less than one third of the production and half of the global supply.

MAIN ISSUES

- > Agricultural productivity
- Agricultural output (300 to 400 Kg/ha for potentials of 800 Kg/ha);
- Quality of production at harvest and post-harvest periods (KOR, degree of humidity, seeding);
- **Fairness in income distribution in the sector.**
- Identification of stakeholders;
- Traceability in the value chain;
- **Price-fixing mechanism**
- **➤ Increase in value addition**
- Local processing and promotion;
- Farm-gate supply chain for exports (raw and finished products);
- Access to domestic and international markets





IMPROVEMENT IN THE QUALITY AND STRUCTURING OF MARKETING AS A SHORT-TERM APPROACH

- Implementation of a national agricultural advisory mechanism for cashew producers;
- Identification of stakeholders in the marketing channels;
- Annual approval for Buyers and Exporters;
- Implementation of a price-fixing mechanism for raw cashew nuts;
- Institution of transaction and traceability documents;
- **Establishment of an IT support system;**
- **➤ Implementation of restrictions and sanctions.**



RESULTS

- Keen interest in the maintenance and renewal of cashew orchards
- Availability of reliable data on marketing/support for the safeguarding of contracts and mobilization of financing;
- Computerized flow management (MIS, GIS, etc.);
- ➤ Improvement in the quality of exported nuts (2 pts of KOR from 2013 to 2014);
- Significant increase in the number of Exporters of raw cashew nuts (from about a fifty to close to a hundred);
- Increase in the sector turnover;
- ➤ Increase in producers' incomes from 200 to 600 CFA francs/Kg of raw cashew nuts
- Drastic decline in fraudulent exports;

LOCAL PROCESSING AS A MEDIUM AND LONG TERM APPROACH

- Local processing program piloted by the Ministry of Industry (Technical assistance to the installed units);
- Agricultural Sector Support Project (PSAC) under the supervision of the Ministry of Agriculture;
- Accelerated Local Processing Program (PPP Models for the establishment of local cashew processing units);
- Attractive investment code particularly in the cashew production areas, potential zones for the establishment of processing units;
- Tax exemptions (DUS and fees) for cashew nut exports;
- Taxation on raw cashew nut exports to improve the raw materials supply capacity of local plants;
- Establishment of grants to support local processing;

LOCAL PROCESSING AS A MEDIUM AND LONG TERM APPROACH

- Law on Warehousing Receipt System in order to create supply conditions for the local units
- ➤ Establishment of a Cashew Technology Centre (Plant-School) designed for training of workers of processing units and of equipment and technology tests);
- ➤ Cashew Processing Technologies and Equipment (SIETTA) the 2nd Edition of which will be held in Abidjan from 17 to 19 November 2016.
- Promotion of local consumption of by-products.



RESULTS

- ➤ Keen interest perceptible in the initiatives for the establishment of processing units;
- ➤ Slight increase in the installed processing capacity of 66 000 tons in 2014 to 91 000 tons in 2015, i.e. an increase of 38%;
- ➤ More than 100 000 tons of ongoing additional capacity or ongoing study which would double the local processing capacity till the end of 2017;
- > Installation of the representation of a Vietnamese equipment supplier in Abidjan.
