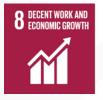

Figure 1: Share of women business leaders in exporting companies



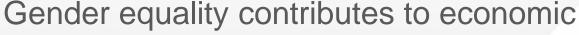

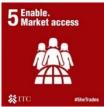

International Buyers

Activities:

Creating market linkages between value chain operators and international buyers through trade fairs, buyer visits, B2B events





First steps

- Prepare regional project launch in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire February 2020
- Confirm project partners, stakeholders and beneficiaries for implementation and synergy creation in national workshops

Conduct gender sensitive value chain analysis and needs assessments







The UK Trade Partnerships Programme (UKTP)

GOAL: Increasing trade between African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) countries and the EU/UK, and creating quality jobs in ACP countries.

HOW? By supporting ACP countries to take advantage of the duty-free, quota-free access to EU and UK markets that they enjoy under Economic Partnership Agreements (EPAs).

WHEN? 2020-2022

Targeted support to the **cashew sector** in Côte d'Ivoire to boost exports to the EU and the UK and create jobs.

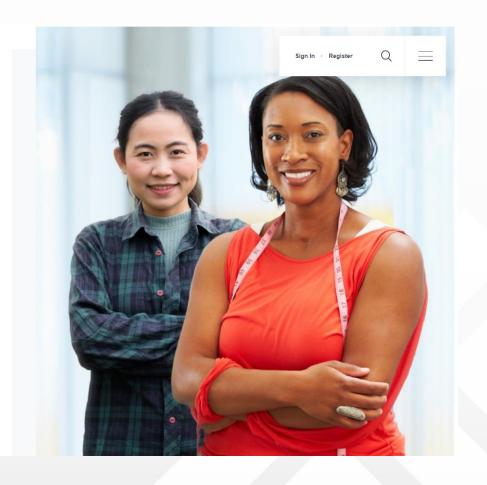
