Introduction


Com cashew match fund project started Oct 2018 until September 2020. Project title "Innovative Cashew production in the Volta Region"





Farmer support laboratory

 The Volta region in Ghana is probably the best place to grow cashew in Ghana and being the closest cashew growing area to the main exit port in the country. However cashew production has been neglected due to the perception that there is "no market or buyers" for raw cashew nuts!



 Ironically one of the worlds largest processors of cashew, Usibras operates right on the door step of the Volta region!

 Providing farmers access to improved grafted planting material. 9 high yielding clones used in our grafting programe. Scion banks planted with best in class clones.



 Facilitating direct market linkages translating to added revenue geared at supporting maintence and expansion costs of cashew farms.




Developments in tissue Culture
